






## Learner Course Slides – 6<sup>th</sup> edition © 2013 - 2021

Please read these instructions before placing the USB or DVD into your computer.

**The Problem:** Effective January 1, 2021, Adobe stopped support of Flash (.swf file extension) technology. If using a PC computer, all web browsers including Internet Explorer and Google Chrome will no longer play Flash files. That means the S.T.A.B.L.E. module slides from prior productions (with a “.swf” file extension) will **no longer work on a PC computer**.

<p><b>Solution 1</b></p>	<p>Order a new USB or DVD from S.T.A.B.L.E. (call the office to discuss pricing options). Open the folder called: <b>.EXE – widescreen – S.T.A.B.L.E. Learner Course Slides</b>. See directions on page 2 for opening the slides.</p>	
	<p>The Executable files contained on the USB or DVD are <b>not compatible for use with MAC OS X</b>.</p> <p>Open the folder called: <b>Adobe Flash - .swf – S.T.A.B.L.E. 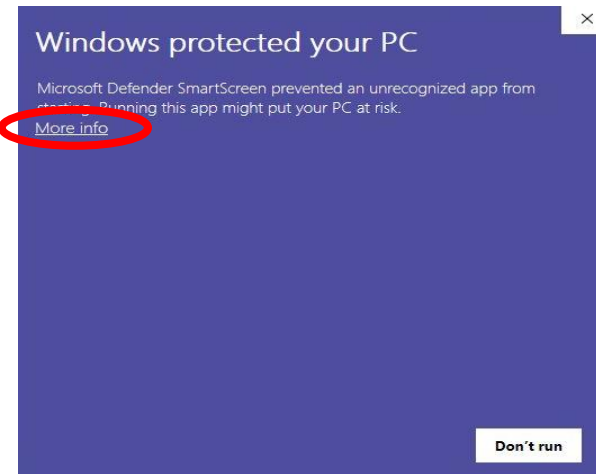
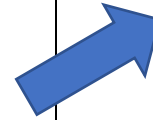
- **Reformatted to a wide-screen format.**
- **4 new narrated videos replace slide content as follows:**
  - o Sugar Module – Malrotation and midgut volvulus and Aerobic and Anaerobic metabolism.
  - o Airway Module – Normal gas exchange and causes of tissue hypoxia.
  - o Blood pressure Module: Shock video plus a new video on subgaleal hemorrhage (not narrated).

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR OPENING THE EXECUTABLE SLIDES ON A PC COMPUTER

**STEP 1** Insert the USB or DVD into your computer, then click on any module to open the file. The following are examples of the warnings we received when we opened a S.T.A.B.L.E. Module for the first time – using Windows 10. These files will also open on a computer with Windows 7 although the warnings might vary depending upon your security settings. Here is our experience:

### STEP 2

You will receive a “warning” that the file is not safe to open. It IS safe to open, so you must click on More info to go to the next step.



### STEP 3

Clicking on More info takes you to this screen.  
Click on **Run anyway**  
It IS safe to open these executable files.



#### STEP 4

The next warning we received was from our Norton antivirus program.

Click on: **Run this program anyway**
